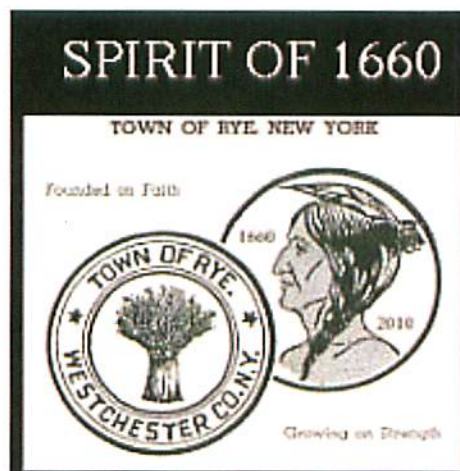
Tuesday, June 29th & Wednesday, June 30th: FLASHBACKS
