This is the City of Rye Police Department calling via the Reverse 911 system with a traffic advisory. The Rye Derby will be held on Sunday, April 28, 2013. The five mile race, which begins on Purchase Street and runs through a large section of the City, will begin at 10:15 A.M. The one mile race, which runs through the Purchase Street/Orchard Avenue/Theodore Fremd Avenue area, will begin at 12:15 P.M. Although most of the routes will remain open to traffic, some temporary detours and intermittent street closings will be necessary, particularly in the downtown area. Please plan accordingly, allow extra travel time, and use caution for runners in the roadway. Thank you.



The Rye Fire Department will open its doors to area residents, so they can learn about what it takes to be a volunteer firefighter in their community, as part of the third annual RecruitNY statewide initiative. As part of RecruitNY, on Sunday, April 28 between 12:00pm and 3:00pm, the Rye Fire Department, located at 15 Locust Ave in Rye, NY will join fire departments all across the state for a unified recruitment drive, as part of National Volunteer Week 2013.

Throughout the open house, The Rye Fire Department will conduct tours of the station and apparatus, allow visitors to try on firefighting gear, and provide activities throughout the firehouse for visitors. The fire department will discuss what it means to be a volunteer, as well as conduct demonstrations and answer questions.

General requirements for membership include any man or woman aged 18 and older who live or work in the City of Rye or a surrounding community and have the desire to participate in fire and/or emergency activities. No training or fire service experience is necessary for membership as The Rye Fire Department will sponsor all necessary training. **RE: New York Works Accelerated Bridge Project
Ridge Street & Weaver Street Bridge Closures
Towns of Rye and Mamaroneck, Westchester County**

Dear Mr. Pickup:

The New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) will be performing work on two bridges in your area this summer. These projects have accelerated construction schedules that allow the work to be completed during the summer months.

- **Ridge Street over I-287 in the Town of Rye**

Ridge Street will be closed to traffic at I-287 beginning Wednesday, June 5 through August 16, 2013. A signed detour will direct Ridge Street traffic onto Purchase Street (Route 120) and Westchester Avenue (Route 120A). Prior to the bridge closure, nighttime lane closures on I-287 to prepare the site will begin May 6, 2013. This work will not impact Ridge Street. All construction is expected to be completed by September 4.

- **Weaver Street (Route 125) over I-95 in the Town of Mamaroneck**

Weaver Street will be closed to traffic at I-95 beginning Monday, June 3 through July 24, 2013. A signed detour will direct Weaver Street traffic onto Murray Avenue and Palmer Avenue. Prior to the bridge closure, nighttime lane closures on I-95 to prepare the site will begin May 24, 2013. This work will not impact Weaver Street. All construction is expected to be completed by August 8, 2013.

The Department will work hard to disseminate information to those potentially affected through temporary roadway message boards, email, direct mail and promotional material. We respectfully request your assistance with this task and ask that you inform your constituents of these planned events through your usual means of community outreach. Please request that residents plan their travel accordingly and use alternate routes whenever possible. Enclosed for your information is a location map and plan showing the locations of the bridge closures and planned detour routes.

City of Rye Police Commissioner William R. Connors has announced the promotion of Police Officer Michael Anfuso to the rank of Sergeant, effective April 22, 2013. A promotion ceremony was held at City Hall on Friday, April 19, 2013.

Sergeant Anfuso was appointed to the rank of Police Officer on January 14, 1999. In addition to patrol duty, he has been assigned as the downtown bicycle officer and as a Field Training Officer. Sergeant Anfuso is a New York State Certified General Topics Instructor, an FBI certified Defensive Tactics Instructor, a Taser Instructor, an Aerosol Restraint Instructor, and a Pepperball Gun Instructor. He was involved in the development of the Department's current Field Training and Defensive Tactics Training programs.

Sergeant Anfuso was born and raised in Rye. He is a graduate of the Rye City Schools and holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Marymount University in Arlington, Virginia. He lives in Brewster with his wife, Elisa, and their three children. Sergeant Anfuso served as the Head Coach of the Rye High School varsity lacrosse team for three years, and worked for the Department of Public Works from 1995 until his appointment as a police officer. He continues a long family history of service to the City of Rye; his father, Peter Anfuso, retired as General Foreman of the Department of Public Works after more than forty years of service, and his aunt, Gail Klepps, retired from the Police Department as a Senior Office Assistant after thirty-five years. His brother, Peter, is currently employed by the Department of Public Works.

During his career, Sergeant Anfuso has made more than six hundred arrests, including four gun arrests.

In announcing the promotion, Commissioner Connors said, "Throughout his career, Mike Anfuso has stood out for his consistent drive and dedication. He has been an outstanding police officer who truly loves his job and the community he serves. I am confident that he will bring the same level of talent and energy to the rank of sergeant, and I congratulate him as he assumes a critical supervisory role in the Department."
